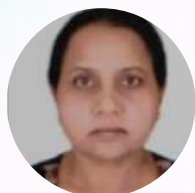

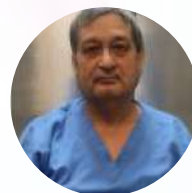

## Delhi – The Host City

Delhi is the city that may surprise you at first but will soon engulf you in a string of new experiences, leaving you entwined with its culture and people. Ruled by some of the most powerful emperors in the history of India, Delhi has transformed into a soulful city embracing each culture with open arms.

The capital of world's largest democracy, Delhi as a city that bridges two contrasting worlds. While Old Delhi is a labyrinth of mysterious narrow lanes, haveli's and majestic mosques, the imperial city of New Delhi is composed of spacious, tree-lined avenues and imposing government buildings. The city has gradually evolved to become a window to India's unique cultures and ethnicities.

The Eternal city offers visitors a sumptuous banquet of history and heritage seamlessly in tune with its transformation as one of the world's fastest growing and largest metropolises today. Monumental architecture here is redolent of the creative genius of successive historical era. Delhi's kaleidoscopic core is ripe for many more cinematic ventures to be staged here. From the opulent expanse of Old Delhi to urbane skyscrapers, tree lined avenues, undulating flyovers, ancient bazaars, and the wonderful Delhi Metro, our city is the visual spectacle like none other.

### Airport

Indira Gandhi International Airport (IATA: DEL, ICAO: VIDP) is the primary international airport serving New Delhi, the capital of India, and the National Capital Region (NCR).

## TOURS

Take advantage of your time in India to visit beautiful historic sites in New Delhi and beyond with other conference participants. Three different tours are available, before and after the conference.

### Tour of Old Delhi



Duration: 7-8 Hours

The area around Red Fort in North Delhi is part of the historic city of Shahjahanabad, built by the Mughal Emperor Shah Jahan in the 17<sup>th</sup> Century. Now known as Old Delhi, it remains largely unchanged in its historic ambience and walking through its narrow lanes will take you back to an earlier time. We first visit Rajghat, the memorial of Mahatma Gandhi, and the National Gandhi Museum. The final stop of the tour is the visit to Red Fort (Lal Qila). Built during the reign of Emperor Shah Jahan was a residence to the royal family.

**Note:** Red Fort is closed on Monday.

## Tour of New Delhi



Duration: 7-8 Hours

The tour to Imperial Delhi will include a visit to the Qutub Minar, the tallest stone tower in India. Qutub-din Aibak started it in 1199. Pulling down 27 Hindu and Jain temples and using their columns erected the attached Quwwat-ul-Islam Mosque also built by him. Visit Lotus Temple, then visit Humayun's tomb, built by the widow of the second Mughal Emperor, Humayun, it is an outstanding monument in the Indo-Persian style, a precursor of the Taj Mahal. The tour also includes a drive past the imposing India Gate (War Memorial), the Parliament Building and the Rashtrapati Bhawan, the President's residence

**Note:** Humayun's tomb & Lotus Temple is closed on Monday.

## Tour to Agra



Duration: 12 Hours

Morning Depart from Delhi at 7AM, for Agra. Reach Agra, visit "Taj Mahal" which was built by the Mughal Emperor Shahjahan as a memorial to his wife, Mumtaz Mahal. After her untimely death, Shah Jahan had her mortal remains buried in this mausoleum. And after his demise he was placed to rest next to his beloved queen in the same mausoleum. Under the dome, below the ground level, in a dimly lit chamber, lie the mortal remains of Shahjahan and his beloved queen Mumtaz, reminding the world of their undying love. After visiting Taj Mahal, proceed for Lunch around 2 pm, later visit to Agra fort, within a radius of 3 kilometers, on the banks of the river Yamuna, rises the crescent like Agra Fort. Designed and built by Akbar in 1565 A.D., the fort is surrounded by a 70 feet high wall. It houses the beautiful Pearl Mosque and numerous palaces including the Jahangir Mahal, Diwan-i-Khas, Diwan-i-Am and Moti Masjid.

Return to Delhi around 7-8 pm

**Note:** Taj Mahal is closed for the public on Friday.
